CREATIVE ARTS projects such as cake decorating, photography, quilting, and scrapbooking.

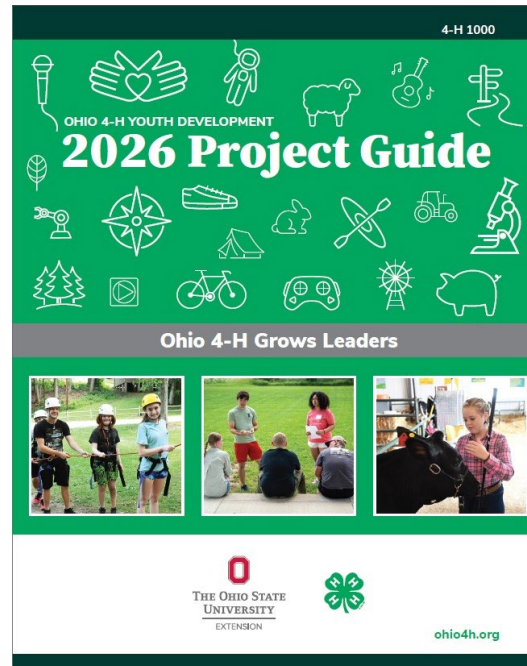
FAMILY & CONSUMER SCIENCE projects include clothing, nutrition, money management, and home living.

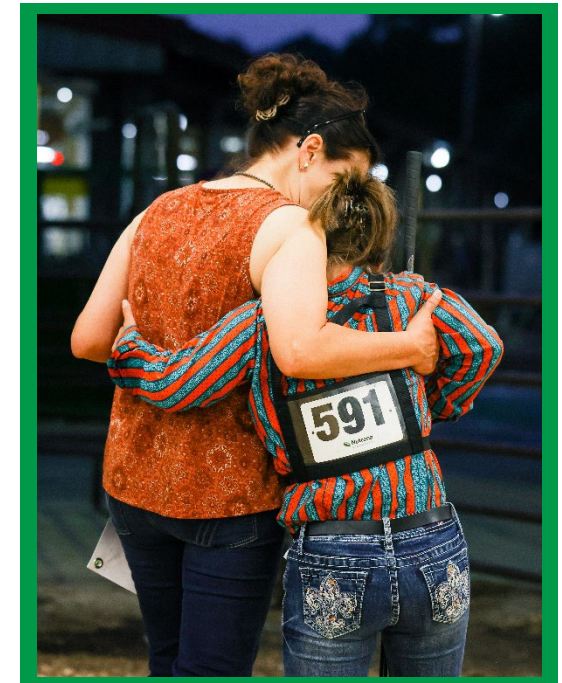

AGE & GRADE REQUIREMENTS

CLOVERBUDS

Eligibility for 4-H Cloverbud membership begins when a child has reached age 5 and is enrolled in kindergarten as of January 1. The Cloverbud program is activity oriented, involves cooperative learning, and is noncompetitive.

MEMBERS

Eligibility for participation in 4-H projects and competitive events begins when a child is age 8 AND in 3rd grade as of January 1.
