

# LLAMA / ALPACA REQUIREMENTS

Own or lease at least one llama. Llama/Alpaca must be 4 months old and in the continual care of the exhibitor by June 1 of the current year.

Members may ONLY exhibit 1 Llama/Alpaca per Class

## **Record Book Requirements:**

- ✓ Read and study and have a working knowledge of the Llama/Alpaca Resource Book
- ✓ Complete five activities in each interest.
- ✓ Two Learning Experiences.
- ✓ Two Leadership/Citizenship activities.
- ✓ Follow and complete all sections of the Project Record Book.
- ✓ Complete Treatment Record.

## **Members must:**

- Be able to answer all questions and be dressed neatly and appropriately for the evaluation process.
- Be able to identify llama/alpaca diseases and the disease symptoms.
- Be able to identify feed and forage samples that may be fed to a llama/alpaca and have knowledge about the nutritional needs of a llama/alpaca.
- Be able to complete a written test on your knowledge of the llama/alpaca project.
- Be able to answer questions on the conformation of a llama/alpaca and basic questions on the showing of a llama/alpaca.
- Have a basic knowledge about the uses of a llama/alpaca.
- Have a basic knowledge about the care, maintenance and husbandry of a llama/alpaca.
- In order to exhibit a llama/alpaca at the Holmes County Fair all 4-H and FFA exhibitors must:
  1. Turn in lease agreement forms, pictures of animals or ILR or ARI registration #'s (if applicable) to the Extension Office by June 1st
  2. Attend Llama/Alpaca Learn Day
  3. Show their llama/alpaca at one outside event or contact a committee member for alternate choice.
  4. Turn in the Fair Entry/Pen Assignment form to the Extension Office by July 1
  5. Complete the llama/alpaca project by being evaluated and test taken at the county Skill-a-Thon.
- All members must be dressed neatly for the evaluation and have completed project records.
