 - ✓ Fair entries due to the Holmes County Extension Office
 - ✓ Clinic dates, place, and time
 - ✓ Show date, place and time

Juniors (Ages 8-11)

Junior requirements include: Read and complete, neatly and accurately, the project and record book. Complete all entries on page 2 of project book. Complete all Beginner Level activities. Complete Quality Assurance Section and Records Section of project book. Take part in 2 Leadership/Citizenship activities. Participate in at least one additional learning experience, such as attending a rabbit show, visiting a rabbitry, attending Livestock Education Day or a Rabbit clinic. Attend Project Evaluation (either Livestock Project Evaluation & Skill-a-thon or a Pre-Evaluation).

Members Must:

- Own and care for at least one rabbit
- Know the difference between a pedigreed and grade rabbit
- What is gestation
- What is rabbit palpation
- Know tools, how, where & why to tattoo

- Know 2 body types
- Know 2 rabbit diseases
- Know 5 parts of a rabbit
- Know 2 parts of a feed tag
- Know 2 breeds

Intermediate & Senior (Ages 12 -19)
