Members must:

- □ Complete a project book and attend Life Skills Judging (July)
- □ Complete required paperwork provided at first dog class
- ☐ Get your picture taken for fair booth in July

- Girls- Dresses, skirts, dress skorts or dress slacks and a collard blouse
- · Boys- dress shirts, ties and dress slacks
